- Screening methods, especially for bacteriology, as we don't know what pathogen we are going for.
- Poster included for the diagnostic tables
- Different layout, for example by system: enteric diseases
- PCR: List of references for sequences; conserved regions
- Virology: PCR: Describe the test that works, reference the others
- Define the audience for the manual
- Include a CD for pics?
- More schematic diagrams/flow charts
- Chapter on sampling and shipping
- Make it look more like a recipe book
- Remove disease information, info not related to the agent
- Maximum number of pages per agent?
- Chapter on how to write SOPs?
- Summarize existing chapters, then send to author: Consider a review board instead of individual authors
